

Henry Keeps Score

5 skill lessons · 3 math-through-reading

Skill lessons

5 lessons on the mathematics the book carries. Each lesson has printable workbook pages and a separate teacher key.

1. How Many More, How Many Fewer

Reasoning · Comparing two groups within five and telling how many more and how many fewer

2. One More Makes It Match

Concept · Finding how many more are needed to make two groups equal, within five

3. Reading the Comparing Chart with Counters

Representation · Building a set from a comparison sentence: one more, one fewer, as many as, none

4. One More, One Fewer: Fast Rounds

Fluency · Computational fluency with one more and one fewer for numbers zero to five

5. Keeping Score at the Pajama Party

Application · Counting two sets up to five and reporting them as a score pair

Math through the reading

The mathematics is reached through a sentence the book prints: change one word in the reading and the numbers change with it. These carry their own standards, matched against these lessons rather than inherited from the skill ones.

6. The Word That Builds the Row

Integrated · Students build a flower row from a comparing sentence, swap one word in that sentence, build the new row beside the first, and say what the word did to the number.

7. Two and One: Did Henry Break His Rule?

Integrated · Students build the book's score pairs, sort them by whether anything is left over, and argue aloud to a partner whether the closing pair of two and one breaks Henry's rule, with both numbers in every argument.

8. Say It the Other Way Round

Integrated · Students build the comparing chart's rows, then say each relation in both directions about one unchanged arrangement, changing the comparison word as the sentence turns around.

Reading and language lessons

5 lessons on the reading and language the book carries - what a word means in its sentence, how a character is shown, how a text is built. No mathematics: these are matched against the English language arts curricula, which are a different and smaller set than the mathematics ones.

9. Henry's Sentence Comes Back

Concept · Hearing a repeated sentence and saying what it does

10. How Henry Sounds

Reasoning · Naming how a character feels and the word that shows it

11. From Wake-Up to Good Night

Application · Retelling a day in order using the text's own time words

12. Words That Put Two People Side by Side

Concept · Using the words that compare two people in a sentence

13. The Curly Mark at the End

Fluency · Reading questions with question intonation and answering in a whole sentence
