Skill lessons

4 lessons on the mathematics the book carries. Printable workbook pages and teacher keys are not available for this book yet.

1. The Bone Is Behind the Bird Feeder

Concept · Describing where an object is with a position word and a named landmark

2. Jill Draws the Yard

Representation · Marking a place on a map of a real space and reading the mark back into it

3. Behind What?

Reasoning · Naming the landmark a position word is measured from, and how many it needs

4. One Mark for Every Bone

Concept · Matching marks to objects one to one and finding the one left over

Math through the reading

The mathematics is reached through a sentence the book prints: change one word in the reading and the numbers change with it. These carry their own standards, matched against these lessons rather than inherited from the skill ones.

5. One Word Moves the Bone

Integrated · Children place two bones for two sentences that differ by one position word, then send a partner to each with a sentence of their own.

6. Which Way Would You Tell the Dog?

Integrated · Children put one bone in a spot two true sentences describe, count the landmarks each sentence needs, and argue aloud for the one they would put on the map.

Reading and language lessons

5 lessons on the reading and language the book carries - what a word means in its sentence, how a character is shown, how a text is built. No mathematics: these are matched against the English language arts curricula, which are a different and smaller set than the mathematics ones.

Language · Hearing the words that move a story to a new day

Language · Noticing a question the book asks you, and answering it
