Skill lessons

4 lessons on the mathematics the book carries. Printable workbook pages and teacher keys are not available for this book yet.

1. Ninety, and Then Albert

Fluency · Skip counting by tens to 100

2. Two Cheesy Puffs, Five Tent Pegs

Fluency · Skip counting by twos and fives

3. Nine Plates, Ninety Sticks

Concept · Counting equal groups — how many groups, how many in all

4. Forty-Five, and Five in Her Hand

Reasoning · Counting on by a group from a stopped count

Math through the reading

The mathematics is reached through a sentence the book prints: change one word in the reading and the numbers change with it. These carry their own standards, matched against these lessons rather than inherited from the skill ones.

5. Two Puffs Each, Not Two Puffs Total

Integrated · Students test what the words each, per and every do to a count by swapping them out of Agnes's own sentences and running the count both ways.

6. The Count Agnes Never Finished

Integrated · Students find the peg total the book stops one number short of, and say which printed sentence tells them the count is not over.

Reading and language lessons

5 lessons on the reading and language the book carries - what a word means in its sentence, how a character is shown, how a text is built. No mathematics: these are matched against the English language arts curricula, which are a different and smaller set than the mathematics ones.
