Lesson sequence

1 Central Idea and Theme - 4 min

Focus:	compassionate intentions can build connection despite flawed decisions.
Teacher direction:	Explain how Oliver's concern for Diggory begins to change the relationship.

Teacher direction:	What central idea about helping another person is supported by Oliver's gift, Dad's judgment, and Diggory's note?

Teacher direction:	How does Oliver change from a collector seeking shocks into someone who acts as Diggory's friend?
Prepared text:	Passage 2, Passage 10, Passage 11, Passage 15 4 Character Development - 4 min
Teacher direction:	How do Oliver's priorities change from planning the Box of Shocks to receiving Diggory's note?

Teacher direction:	How do Oliver's actions toward Diggory and Diggory's final note show that their relationship has changed?
Student product:	One integrated response revised across the selected evidence moves.

Assessment

- States an idea broad enough to connect all cited moments
- Distinguishes Oliver's good intention from his unsafe decisions
- Supports the idea with Diggory's response
- Presents a clear claim about Oliver's change
- Uses evidence from both the beginning and later parts of the story
