THE MOVE

Reverse an object's meaning through circumstance

WHY THIS PASSAGE

Queequeg's coffin was built for anticipated death, then converted into a life-buoy that keeps Ishmael alive. Circumstance reverses the object's function so completely that death's container becomes the means of survival.

MARK

Underline the coffin's original purpose. Circle the sequence that changes its practical function after the Pequod sinks. Star the exact reversal where the object designed for death supports life.

NOTICE

- What meaning does the coffin carry before the disaster?
- What physical properties allow that meaning to change?

- Why is survival by coffin more thematically powerful than survival by an ordinary piece of wreckage?

THINK

Answer provisionally: Why is Ishmael saved by an object designed for death? Choose the strongest interpretation you can defend from this passage alone.

WRITE

Write a short evidence-based response to: Why is Ishmael saved by an object designed for death? Use at least two details from the assigned passage and explain how they support your interpretation.

CLOSE

Name the single detail that most changed or sharpened your interpretation, and explain why.

STRONG ANSWER	The coffin changes meaning because circumstance changes function. An object built in anticipation of death becomes buoyant material that keeps Ishmael alive, turning memorial preparation into survival technology.
EVIDENCE	Use the coffin's original purpose, its conversion to a life-buoy, and Ishmael's survival on it.
WATCH FOR	Do not stop at irony. Explain how physical function allows symbolic meaning to reverse.
SOLO	Read the exact passage independently.
SUPPORTED	Use narration and sentence highlighting while reading the same passage.
LISTENING	Listen to the exact passage; visual following is optional. Same question and evidence demand.
